James City County Police - Zone Map





IBR Group A & B Offenses

IBR Offenses FY 2010

Incident Based Reporting (IBR) captures all actual (excluding unfounded) offenses known to police, which is different from Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) where only the most serious crimes are captured by using the Hierarchy Rule. This report may not be identical to the information from the Crimes in Virginia report because of the reporting guidelines set by the state. By IBR standards all known crimes are either Group A or Group B Offenses. Clearances are reported only in Group A Offenses. The next sections show all known crimes by offense group.






