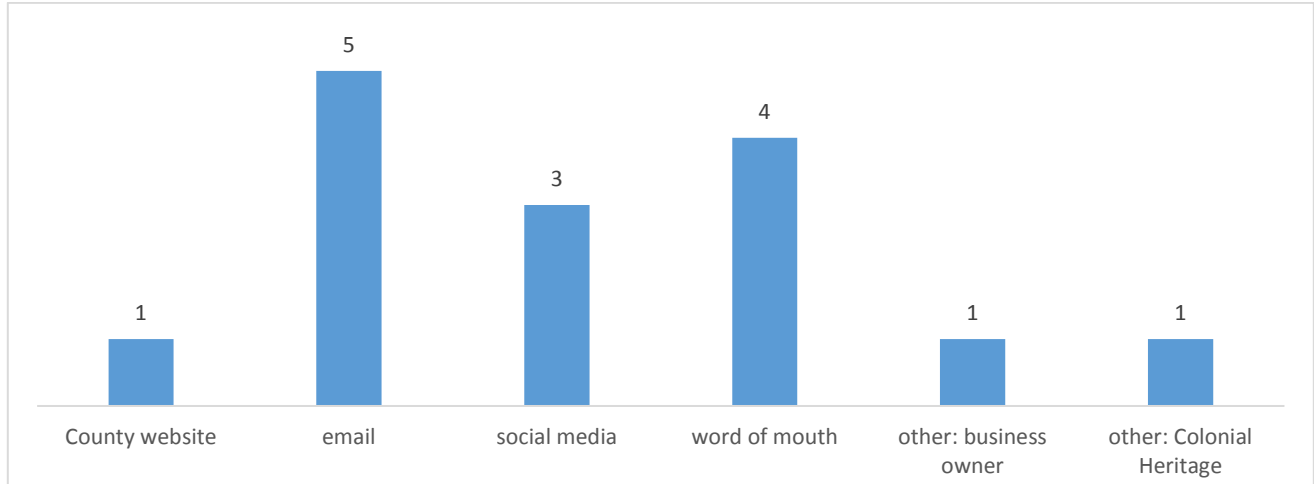

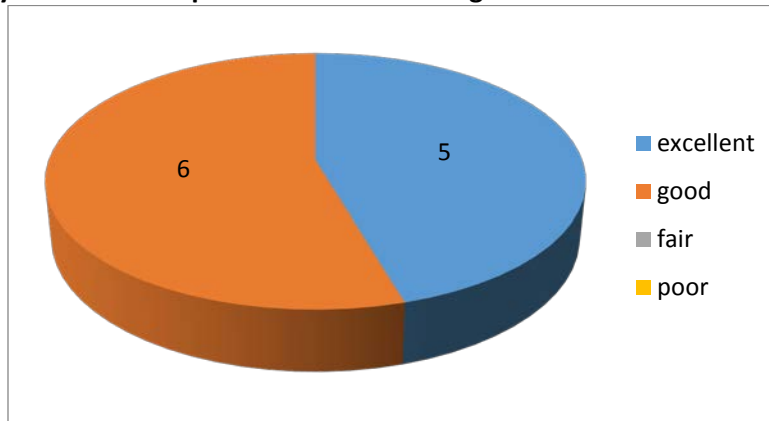
July 12, 2017 Neighborhood Forum Meeting Evaluation Results
